Dear Parents/ Guardians,

Welcome back to school in Term 2. I hope all students have a wonderful short break and are ready to settle down for some serious learning work.

1. Mid-Year Examinations

Please take note that the school will be conducting the Mid-Year Examinations for Primary 1 to Secondary 4 from 9 May to 21 May 2019. The school hopes that you will help to monitor your child/ward's progress in his/her school work and help him/her to establish healthy study habits.

3. Textile Recycling Project

In alignment with the school vision, mission and values, and to foster a caring, quality school culture, the school places special emphasis on our school values of Respect and Responsibility throughout the year. From Term 2 onwards, the school is starting a textile recycling project to teach students how to show respect to the environment. All pupils are encouraged to bring the following for recycling purposes:

- Clean clothes
- Clean and wearable paired of shoes
- Clean household linen (e.g. bed sheets and towels)
- Accessories (e.g. belts and bags)

4. Speak English Campaign

The school will relaunch the Speak English Campaign from Term 2 onwards. All students are required to speak English as much as possible with their classmates, teachers, and everyone else in the school. Although we are most likely to struggle with the implementation and enforcement of this initiative to create the desired learning outcome we strive for, we are ready to keep going against all the odds as we firmly believe that the improvement of our student's English skills is just further down the road.



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5. Morning Assembly – Arrival Procedure

This is a gentle reminder that you need to bring your child/ward to school before 7.57 am. The first bell will ring at 7.57 am. Students who come after the first bell will not be allowed to enter their classrooms and their names will be taken down by the prefects. This is to ensure that the students do not wander around the school compound while waiting for the second bell to ring. There is no deduction of points during this time frame (7.57 am - 7.59 am). However, if the student arrives after the second bell rings at 8.00 am, this is considered late and points will be deducted. Please note that the prefects are part of our school's discipline committee, hence please treat them with due respect.

6. Developing Independent Learners

Please train your child/ward to take up the responsibility of packing up his/her school bag every day to ensure that everything is ready for lessons. Please refrain from delivering things that your child/ward has forgotten to bring along to school because this will cause him/her to cultivate a bad habit of relying on you pertaining to such matters.

7. Monitoring the threats of social media

Please monitor your child/ward's usage of social media and remind him/her to stay alert as there are plenty of threats like online predators, cyberbullying, online scams, inappropriate contents, etc.

8. Road Safety

If your child/ward is coming to school or going home by himself/herself, please remind him/her to use the overhead bridge, underpass or traffic light to cross the road/s safely. No jay walking is permitted.

9. Students' Lunch

If your child/ward is staying back in school for co-curricular activities (CCA) or remedial/supplementary classes in the afternoon, parents/guardians are allowed to bring home-cooked food for students to eat at the canteen. However, please refrain from bringing seafood, pork and fast food from McDonalds, Kentucky, etc. as the school is teaching our students to eat healthy and nutritious food.

10. Money's Matters

The school does not allow any students to borrow money from one another and/or bring items to sell to other students in order to avoid any monetary issues. If your child/ward is in need of money, he/she can only borrow from his/her teachers.
